Dear Parent/ Carer,

This booklet will provide you with information and guidance you may require to support your child.

You will find guidance from each subject about the following:

***What learners will be working on between now and the January practice exams.**

***How learners can prepare for the prelim in January**

This year our Practice Exam Diet will take place between 8th January 2024 and 31st January 2024.

Exams will take place in the Gym/ Games Hall and will be supervised by our SQA invigilation team.

Pupils will be given an exam timetable at the end of November. This will allow them to plan and begin their revision. Supported Study will take place in various departments throughout December.

In December there will be an assembly for each year group. This will explain how the Practice Exam Diet will be run, rules and expectations of behavior and advice for pupils who are ill/ late amongst other important information. During Practice exams, pupils should be properly equipped for each exam, know where their exam takes place and must not talk to or distract other pupils. Mobile phones and smart watches (that can receive texts, calls or access the internet) are not permitted in the exam hall.

An individualised timetable will be issued to all pupils when they return in January. This will contain their seat number, all their exams and any additional time/ differing accommodation that the pupil is entitled to. Pupils must check these to ensure that their name is spelled correctly, their address is correct, and that all the exams they should be sitting are on it.

We recognize that the Practice Exam Diet can be a daunting experience for our young people. Lots of guidance, help and wellbeing advice are in place to support them during this time.

National 5 Administration & IT

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**

Paper 1: Assignment worth 70 marks – 3 hours (including a 15-minute break)

The assignment requires candidates to complete a series of tasks based around planning an event. This assessment covers the following areas of the course:

- Word processing/desktop publishing
- Communication in Administration (Internet Research, PowerPoint, E-mail, E-Diary)
- Theory

Paper 2: Question Paper worth 50 marks – 2 hours

This assessment covers the following areas of the course:

- Spreadsheets
- Database
- Theory

Both papers are IT-based, closed-book assessments that will take place within the ICT department.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**

- Candidates have completed the course. Most of the time remaining this term will focus on revision of Word Processing, Database, Presentation and Communication topics in preparation for the prelim and final assignment.
- In addition, some time will be spent on revising theory topics with a focus on structuring answers appropriately for each command word. Theory topics will be assessed in the assignment and question paper.

- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**

- ✓ Use resources on Teams to revise and make use of Past Paper questions to measure themselves against exam standard. The school also has a subscription to the Achieve website, which provides a wide range of revision notes, resources, and activities. Pupils should be able to register and log in to access these for free.
- ✓ As well as the prelim in January, the final practical assignment will be undertaken in February/early March. These require practical skills in all application software and internet research. These should be given time as part of pupils' revision as well.
- ✓ Ensure to revise all theory topics also, as these are assessed in both papers.
- ✓ Supported study may be available at lunchtimes throughout December – make use of these drop-in sessions to help perfect your skills.

Higher Administration & IT

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**
Paper 1: Assignment worth 70 marks
Paper 2: Written Question Paper worth 50 marks

There is an externally assessed component which comprises 58% of the exam. This must be completed by the end of March to be submitted to the SQA.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**
 - Candidates are continuing to develop and perfect their IT skills and develop confidence and knowledge in Databases and Word Processing.
 - Pupils will also be increasing their knowledge of the Theory topics at Higher as there are some concepts that are completely new that were not in the National 5 course.
 - We will also be working on Higher theory answer structures and how to work effectively with the Command Words in order to correctly answer the question.
- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**
 - ✓ Use resources on Teams to revise and make use of Past Paper questions to measure themselves against exam standard. The school also has a subscription to the Achieve website, which provides a wide range of revision notes, resources, and activities. Pupils should be able to register and log in to access these for free.
 - ✓ As well as the prelim in January, the final practical assignment will be undertaken in March. These require practical skills in all application software. These should be given time as part of pupils' revision as well.
 - ✓ Theory plays a much more prominent role in the Higher course than in National 5 (written question paper is worth 42% of the overall grade). Candidates should dedicate study time to the theory topics and spend time developing written responses. Past papers are available for free on the SQA website that will give a good insight into the types of questions that can be asked.
 - ✓ Supported study may be available at lunchtimes throughout December – make use of these drop-in sessions to help perfect your skills.

National 5 Art & Design

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**

Question paper:

The question paper will consist of a booklet with 2 sections:

Section 1: Expressive

Candidates will answer Q1 and one other question from section 1.

Section 2: Design. Candidates will also answer Q7 and 1 other question from section 2.

The paper is worth 50 marks which makes up 20% of the overall grade. The exam will last 2 hours.

Practical exam: Candidates will have an entire day dedicated to working on the Expressive folio final, which should bring the expressive folio to completion.

Both the Expressive folio and Design folios are externally assessed components which comprises 80% of the exam. This must be submitted by March 15th for submission to the SQA.

- **Between now and the January prelim, pupils will be working on bothfolios and should be studying their chosen artists and designers at home, ensuring they fill in the information required to complete their study booklets.**
- **To prepare for their question paper, pupils should be practicing past papers accessed through Teams or through the SQA website. Other 'unseen questions' will be shared on Teams.**

Higher Art & Design

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**

Question paper:

The question paper will consist of a booklet with 2 sections: Section 1, **Expressive** and section 2: **Design**. Candidates will answer Q1 and **two** other question from section 1. Candidates will also answer Q7 and **two** other question from section 2. The paper is worth 60 marks which makes up 23% of the overall grade. The exam will last 2.5 hours.

Practical exam: Candidates will have an entire day dedicated to working on the Expressive folio final, which should bring the expressive folio to completion.

Both the Expressive folio and Design folios are externally assessed components which comprises 77% of the exam. This must be submitted by March 15th for submission to the SQA.

- **Between now and the January prelim, pupils will be working on both folios and should be studying their chosen artist and designer at home, ensuring they fill in the information required to complete their study booklets.**
- **To prepare for their question paper, pupils should be practicing pass papers accessed through Teams or through the SQA website. Other 'unseen questions' will be shared on Teams.**

Format of the Practice Exam:

Paper 1: Section 1 contains multiple-choice questions and has 25 marks

Paper 2: Section 2 contains structured and extended response questions and has 75 marks

What will learners be working on between now and the January Prelim?

- Learners have covered Unit 3, Life on Earth and will continue to work through Unit 1 of the course, Cell Biology.
- The prelim will assess Units 1 & 3 of the N5 course. The question paper has two sections.
- Learners will continue to prepare for their prelim assessment by undertaking key area revision questions and homework exercises based on past papers.
- Learners undertake the practical assignment part of the course during October.
This is worth 20% of the overall award.

How can learners prepare for the prelim in January?

- Learners should read over class notes covering Unit 3 Life on Earth and Unit 1 Cell Biology making their own revision materials – mind maps, flashcards (on paper or apps e.g. quizlet).
- Learners can also use the revision website “Achieve”; accessed by clicking the link below and creating an account or signing in if you've previously set up an account. What will learners be working on between now and the January Prelim?

- Learners have covered Unit 1 DNA and the Genome, and will continue working through Unit 2 Metabolism and Survival until the prelim.
- The prelim will assess Units 1 & 2 of the Higher course. The question paper has two sections.
- Learners will continue to prepare for their prelim assessment by undertaking key area revision questions, homework exercises based on past papers, completing SQA extended response questions, and timed SQA Past Papers.
- Learners undertake the practical assignment part of the course during February.
This is worth 20% of the overall award.

Paper 1: Section 1 contains multiple-choice questions and has 20 marks

Paper 2: Section 2 contains structured and extended response questions and has 80 marks

What will learners be working on between now and the January Prelim?

- Learners have covered Unit 1 Cells and Proteins Key Areas 1, 2, and 3, Unit 2 Organisms and Evolution Key Areas, 1, 2, and 3, and are working on Unit 3 Investigative Biology.
- The prelim will assess Units 1 (key areas 1, 2, and 3), Unit 2 (key areas 1, 2, and 3), and Unit 3 (all key areas) of the AH course. The question paper has two sections.
- Learners will continue to prepare for their prelim assessment by undertaking key area revision questions, homework exercises based on past papers, completing SQA extended response questions, and timed SQA Past Papers.
- Learners will begin to undertake the practical project part of the course starting in October. **This is worth 25% of the overall award.**

How can learners prepare for the prelim in January?

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**
Paper 1: Written Question Paper worth 90 marks – 2 hours

There is an externally assessed component which comprises 25% of the exam. This must be submitted by the end of February to be submitted to the SQA.

What will learners be working on between now and the January Prelim?

- Learners have completed Understanding Business, Marketing and Operations. Finance and People have still to be completed; learners will have completed Finance and most of the People unit by the prelim.
- Learners will begin working on the Coursework Assignment which is worth 25% of the overall grade for National 5 Business Management. This will be sent to the SQA for marking in March 2024.

How can learners prepare for the prelim in January?

- ✓ Use the revision checklist handed out at the start of all units – this includes all the topics covered which learners must be prepared to be assessed on. These are also posted on class Teams pages.
- ✓ Revise using past paper questions and then check answers with SQA Marking Instructions. Past papers are available for free on the SQA website and are uploaded onto Class Teams. If a candidate would like some past papers printed, please feel free to ask a member of staff.

Paper 1: Written Question Paper worth 90 marks – 2 hours 45 minutes

There is an externally assessed component which comprises 25% of the exam. This must be submitted by the end of March to be submitted to the SQA.

What will learners be working on between now and the January Prelim?

- Learners have completed Understanding Business and are now moving on to Marketing and Operations. People and Finance have still to be completed; learners will have completed People and most of the Finance unit by the prelim.
** Learners will only be assessed on the units covered in the practice exams.
- Learners will begin working on the Coursework Assignment which is worth 25% of the overall grade for Higher Business Management. This will be sent to the SQA for marking in March 2024.

How can learners prepare for the prelim in January?

Paper 2: Section 2 contains structured and extended response questions and has 75 marks

What will learners be working on between now and the January Prelim?

- Learners have covered Unit 1, Chemical Changes and Structure and will continue to work through Unit 2 of the course – Nature’s Chemistry.
- The prelim will assess Units 1 & 2 of the N5 course. The question paper has two sections.
- Learners will continue to prepare for their prelim assessment by undertaking key area revision questions, homework exercises based on past papers and Satchel One quizzes/Microsoft Form exercises.
- Learners will continue to work on improving calculations including calculations based on equations, titrations and energy calculations.
- Learners will continue to prepare for their prelim assessment by undertaking open-ended and revision questions on a regular basis.
- Learners undertake the practical assignment part of the course during December.
This is worth 20% of the overall award.

What will learners be working on between now and the January Prelim?

- The prelim will assess Units 1 & 3 of the Higher course. The question paper has two sections.
- Learners will continue to prepare for their prelim assessment by undertaking key area revision questions, homework exercises based on past papers, and Satchel One/Microsoft Form exercises.
- Learners undertake the practical assignment part of the course during December.
This is worth 20% of the overall award.

How can learners prepare for the prelim in January?

- Learners should read over class notes covering Unit 1 Chemical Changes and Structure and Unit 3 Chemistry in Society making their own revision materials – mind maps, flashcards.

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**

Paper 1: Question Paper worth 80 marks – 1 hour 30 minutes

There is an externally assessed component which comprises 33% of the exam. This must be submitted by the end of February to be submitted to the SQA.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**

- Candidates have broadly completed the vast majority of the course, except the optional Database unit. This will be starting shortly after the October Break.
- Most of the time remaining this term will centre on Software Development, which will involve an assessment in this area.
- In addition, some time will be spent going over Systems and Web Topics in preparation for these topics appearing in the January prelim.

- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**

- ✓ Revise using past paper questions and then check answers with SQA marking instructions. Past papers are available for free on the SQA website and are uploaded onto Class Teams. If a candidate would like any past papers printed, please feel free to ask a member of staff.
- ✓ Make use of all notes booklets for each topic which contain theory and questions to test knowledge.
- ✓ Ensure that they meet all deadlines set for the Coursework Assignment.
- ✓ Use all resources in the class Teams and complete all set assignments.

Higher Computing Science

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**
Paper 1: Question Paper worth 80 marks – 2 hours

There is an externally assessed component which comprises 33% of the exam. This must be submitted by the end of March to be submitted to the SQA.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**
 - Candidates are currently working on the Software Design and Development unit and are undergoing periodic learning checks (small assessments) to assess knowledge in each area.
 - Pupils are also working on the optional Database unit to increase their knowledge in this area. There will be a end of unit assessment for this topic.
 - Moving forward, candidates will then be covering Computer Systems and revising key topics that may come up in the practice exam.
- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**
 - ✓ Revise using past paper questions and then check answers with SQA Marking Instructions. Past papers are available for free on the SQA website and are uploaded onto Class Teams. If a candidate would like any past papers printed, please feel free to ask a member of staff.
 - ✓ Ensure that they meet all deadlines set for the Coursework Assignment.

Advanced Higher Computing Science

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**
Paper 1: Question Paper worth 55 marks – 2 hours

There is an externally assessed component which comprises **60%** of the exam. This must be submitted by the end of March to be submitted to the SQA.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**
 - Candidates are developing skills in Web Design and Database (Mr D'Annunzio's class).
 - Pupils are also continuing to develop their skills and knowledge in Software Development (with Mrs Blackburn).
 - Underpinning this, pupils are working on their projects which is worth 60% of their overall mark. Pupils at this stage should have completed the analysis and have a clear idea of their project focus.
- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**
 - ✓ Meet all deadlines set with regards to completing the coursework.
 - ✓ Revise using past paper questions and then check answers with SQA Marking Instructions. Past papers are available for free on the SQA website and are uploaded onto Class Teams. If a candidate would like any past papers printed, please feel free to ask a member of staff.
 - ✓ Use all resources within the class Team and complete all set assignments.

Design & Manufacture – N5

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**
Question Paper: 1hr 45 mins

For the final course award there are two externally assessed components, the Design Assignment which comprises 30% of the overall grade and the Question Paper which makes up 45% of the overall grade. There is also an internally assessed component; the Practical Model, contributing 25% towards the overall grade.

These must be completed, usually by April, to be submitted to the SQA.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**
Learners will continue to develop their practical skills through manufacturing in the workshop whilst also building upon their 'Materials and Manufacture' knowledge. They will also be introduced to the 'Design' unit which will prepare them for final design assignment.
- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**
Learners should use the Revision Topic List that will be issued to them by their teachers to direct their preparation at home for the practice exam. It is recommended that the online resources and SQA past papers should be used, with responses checked against the marking instructions. Pupils should be revising their own notes that they have compiled from class and reading over the relevant notes in the files section of Teams.

Design & Manufacture – Higher

- **Format of the Practice Exam: Question Paper**
Question Paper: 2 Hours 15 Mins – 80 Marks

The final course award for Higher Design & Manufacture comprises of an externally assessed assignment and the final exam. The assignment is usually completed by the end of March and is submitted to SQA for marking.

The assignment is completed during class time and makes up 50% of the final course award.

The question paper is completed during the SQA exam diet and makes up the remaining 50% of the final course award.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**

August – October

Pupils work on Higher Unit 1 developing their knowledge and understanding of design factors and materials & manufacturing processes. This culminates in an end of unit question paper and product investigation report. Homework tasks are set throughout the unit based on SQA past paper questions.

October – December

Pupils work on Higher Unit 2 developing their knowledge and understanding of the theory behind the design process while undertaking a practice design assignment. The practice assignment is marked in class, as pupils progress through each stage, and the marking scheme and feedback is shared with pupils. The unit culminates with an end of unit question paper.

Homework tasks continue to provide pupils with opportunity to build their exam technique by practicing SQA past paper questions.

The final course award for Higher Graphic Communication comprises of an externally assessed assignment and the final exam. The assignment is usually completed by mid-March and is submitted to SQA for marking.

The assignment is completed during class time and is worth 50 marks, making up 36% of the final course award. The question paper is completed during the SQA exam diet and is worth 90 marks, making up the remaining 64% of the final course award.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**

August – October

Pupils work on developing CAD modelling skills, culminating in a CAD assignment and a written question paper. This provides feedback on learning and helps to identify areas where further practice is required. Theory lessons focus on knowledge relating to CAD, as well as aspects of the course such as; impact of graphics on the environment and society, the 3P's and British Standards. Homework tasks provide pupils with the opportunity to build their skill in responding to exam style questions relating to these areas.

November – December

Pupils will begin to work on developing their desktop publishing skills, culminating in a DTP assignment and DTP written assessment. Theory lessons focus on knowledge relating to DTP, as well as the remaining areas of the course. Homework tasks continue to provide pupils with opportunity to build their exam technique, and cover much of the course content to this point.

January – March

Pupils complete a short sketching unit which provides pupils with the opportunity to enhance their skills in orthographic and pictorial sketching. The assessment at the end of this unit requires pupils to demonstrate their sketching skills at higher level.

The three assignments throughout this course mirror the format of a final course assignment and written tests reflect the style and challenge of the SQA exam. Pupils also have the opportunity to attempt timed practice assignments and receive feedback on these, before completing the final SQA task in March.



- **Format of the Practice Exam:**

Question paper:

The question paper will consist of a booklet with 2 sections: Section 1 consists of ten multiple choice questions and is worth 10 marks, all questions must be answered. Section 2 consists of two analysis questions each being worth ten marks. Candidates must attempt all questions. The paper is worth 30 marks which makes up 23% of the overall grade. The exam will last 1 hour.

There is also a practical folio which consists of research, planning and evaluation of photoshoots and 8 final photographs. This component is worth 77% of the exam. This must be submitted by March 15th to be submitted to the SQA.

- **Between now and the January prelim, pupils will be working on folios and studying their chosen photographers at home. They are required to complete their weekly plans and photoshoot timelines.**
- **To prepare for their question paper, pupils should be practicing pass papers accessed through Teams or through the SQA website. Other analysis questions will be shared on Teams.**

Practical Woodwork – N5

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**
Question Paper: 1hr

The final course award for National 5 Practical Woodwork comprises of an internally assessed practical model and the externally assessed final exam.

The practical model is worth 70 marks, making up 70% of the final course award. This element of the course is completed during class time and is usually finished by mid-March before being internally marked and moderated within the school.

The question paper is completed during the SQA exam diet and is worth 60 marks, making up the remaining 30% of the final course award.

This is the first year since 2019 that National 5 Practical Woodwork has had a written exam – this element of the course had been removed during the pandemic but has now been re-introduced.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**

Learners will continue to develop their practical woodworking skills by manufacturing practice models and producing practice joints in the workshop. They will continue to develop and consolidate their woodwork theory knowledge and problem solving skills during theory-based lessons focusing on wood types, workshop machinery and safety, hand tools and woodworking techniques.

- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**

Learners should use the revision materials issued on Microsoft Teams by their teachers to direct their preparation at home for the practice exam. It is recommended that the online resources and SQA past papers should be used, with responses checked against the marking instructions. Pupils should be revising their own notes that they have compiled from class and reading over the relevant notes in the files section of Teams.

Practical Cookery – N5

Format of the Practice Exam:

Assignment: 1 hour 30 minutes

National 5 Practical Cookery has 3 separate elements that are assessed.

The assignment, which is 13% of the exam, is the planning stage and must be completed before the practical activity can take place. The final assignments are sent to SQA for marking.

The practical activity is an internally assessed component which comprises 62% of the exam. This is usually completed by end of March. Marks for the final practical activity are submitted to the SQA.

The question paper comprises of 25% of the exam.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**

Learners will finish all unit assessments by Christmas.

Learners will practice dishes in class for the practice exam which will comprise of a starter, main course and dessert.

Learners will complete the assignment and practical activity for the practice exam before Christmas.

In January, learners will revise over course content to prepare for the written question paper during the practice exam diet.

- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**

Learners should use SQA past paper questions and the corresponding marking instructions to check responses. Pupils should be revising their own notes that they have compiled in their jotters and workbooks. Class teachers will issue revision notes for learners to use. Learners can practice practical cookery skills at home using a bank of recipes provided by the class teacher.

- **Format of the Practice Exam:**

Component 2 and component 3 are inter-related and will be assessed using one activity. Candidates will carry out one task — designing, planning, making, finishing and evaluating a cake — which will provide evidence for both components.

The practical activity is an internally assessed component which comprises 53% of the exam. The assignment is 22% of the exam. Components 2 and 3 are usually completed by the end of March. Marks for the practical activity are to be submitted to the SQA. The assignments are sent to SQA for marking. The question paper comprises of 25% of the exam.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**

From October to December learners will be undertaking the practical activity and assignment for the practice exam. They will work simultaneously through both components. The brief is ‘Design and make a Christmas/celebration cake.’ The practice exam will mirror the final exam in terms of skills and ability.

- **How can learners prepare for the Practice Exam in January?**

Learners should use SQA past paper questions and the corresponding marking instructions to check responses. Pupils should be revising their own notes that they have compiled in their jotters and A3 paper.

Learners are regularly offered sugar paste to take home to allow them to practice any skills covered in class at home. Where possible learners should watch videos on the 7 practical cake decorating skills they are assessed on. The class teacher will share these links on teams. Learners are welcome to borrow equipment from the department which will help them practice skills at home.

- **What will learners be working on between now and the January Practice Exam?**
The skills tested in Spanish are Reading, Listening, Talking and Writing. Learners will complete the Culture and Learning topics for which they are given a booklet that they can use both in class and at home. The booklets contain all of the talking and writing questions we will work through at the front as well as various reading and listening activities. All past papers relating to the topic can be found towards the back of the booklet. The sound files for the listening tasks are on the class Team. Pupils are also working on their portfolio which is based on the novel *Diarios de Motocicleta*. Their essay should be between 1200–1500 words (excluding quotes and bibliography). They have a copy of the novel to use both in class and at home as well as booklets to help their understanding of the text and analyse the main themes. The portfolio is worth 30 marks which counts for 15% of pupils' overall final mark. Pupils are also working on their discursive writing skills. Pupils are given essay questions as we work through the course in order to help prepare them for the practice exam and final exam.
