OECD TopClassPodcast - how climate education can get us to net-zero


In the OECD's PISA survey of 66 countries in 2018, 88% of high-school principals reported that climate change was covered in their school's curriculum. But it was Italy that was the first country in the world to make climate change coursework mandatory in all public schools. Lorenzo Fioramonti drove Italy's climate education reform. Nita Seng is a middle-school math and science teacher and co-director of Subject to Climate. She gives us the teacher's point of view on reforming school curricula to integrate climate education.
