Learning and Teaching Idea of the Month


Dual Codina

Dual Coding Theory is a theory of cognition and how we think. Dual Coding combines visuals/graphics with text/verbal; it encourages us to use two different channels for processing.

Oliver Caviglioli has written a book called dual coding for Teachers. Gary Lamb has contributed to the book and it is a fascinating read into this learning strategy. This can be borrowed from our CLPL library.

Julie Sloan and Marisa Kerr have recently used this strategy in English and History lessons. Roisin McCardle exemplifies how using bar models in Maths to aids with understanding of fractions.
