

Sharing good practice

Active Learning

Fiona Farrel has been using Active Learning activities such as Flip-Cups and Trip Wire to aid recall and revision in PE.

Trip Wire is a revision game focusing on Team Dynamics. Groups are given a series of revision questions. For each question answered correctly they receive time to cross the class. Once all questions are answered the time starts, groups must join hands forming a human chain and then proceed to go over or under the Trip Wire without touching it. If pupils touch the wire they must go back to the start. The aim is to get to the other side of the room in their allocated time without triggering the Trip Wire.

Skills Share Sessions




Learning and Teaching Idea of the Month
